



## What to do with items on the NOT ACCEPTED LIST?

Electronic Waste	Check the Yellow Pages for "Electronics Recycling."
Liquid waste of any kind (including paint, peanut oil, fryer oil, etc.)	Solid waste landfills do not accept liquids. Liquids, including latex paint and fryer oil, may be solidified with cat litter or saw dust. Once all the liquid is absorbed and dry, the waste can be bagged and put in regular household trash for pick-up by your regular trash company. For cooking or motor oil, contact Public Works Field Services at 303.438.6334.
Any single item that is too big or too heavy to be lifted by two people	These items can be dismantled into smaller manageable pieces and placed at the curb before 7 a.m. for the Spring Cleanup. If you miss that opportunity, you are responsible to take them directly to a landfill or arrange for special pick-up with your regular trash hauler for a fee. (See following page for landfill locations and phone numbers.)
Any appliance with a Freon unit, such as refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners	Freon is <b>hazardous</b> and requires handling by a state certified operator. Contact your power company (Xcel Energy, United Power) or certified Freon removal company to properly remove your appliances.
Tires	Most tire companies in Broomfield take used tires for a minimal fee of approximately \$5.
Cars and car bodies	Check the internet or Yellow Pages for charities that accept vehicles. Donations of vehicles to a nonprofit classified with the IRS as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization are tax deductible. Also, check with car salvage yards.
Any items listed as a hazardous material; any corrosive, flammable, reactive or combustible materials (including ammunition); pesticides, herbicides, car batteries, antifreeze, motor oil, radioactive materials or pharmaceuticals	Broomfield's Household Hazardous Waste drop-off day is May 10, by appointment only. Call 303.438.6334 to schedule an appointment. If you miss this opportunity, Broomfield residents can dispose of chemicals at the regional Hazardous Materials Management facility in Boulder at no charge, year-round. Contact 720.564.2251 for additional information. <b>Please note that the Boulder facility does not accept electronic waste.</b> Broomfield will have a prescription drug take-back event on Saturday, April 26, to collect unused pharmaceuticals.
Propane tanks from barbeques or helium tanks	Check the Metro Denver Yellow Pages under "GAS-Propane." Most of the companies will take old propane tanks. Some charge a nominal disposal fee; others recycle them for free ( MetroGas, 790 W. 64 <sup>th</sup> Ave., 303.428.3036 recycles for free.)
Concrete, concrete pavers, bricks, soil, sod, grass clippings	Contact Habitat for Humanity for bricks or pavers. Other items should be delivered to a landfill. (See following page for landfill locations and phone numbers.)
Tree limbs or tree stumps less than 12" diameter, shrubs	Tree limbs less than 12" diameter may be recycled at the Tree Branch Recycling drop-off at 225 Commerce Street on Wednesdays from 1-5 p.m. and Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
Sealed containers or drums larger than 5 gallons	Contact your regular trash hauler for specific instructions. Note: see liquid waste above.
Business, commercial, industrial or agricultural waste	This program is for <b>residents</b> only. Businesses must contract individually for trash collection.
Household trash	Residents must contract individually for curbside pickup of regular household trash. Check <a href="http://www.Broomfield.org">www.Broomfield.org</a> for a list of licensed trash haulers in Broomfield.
Fire Extinguishers	Look in the Yellow Pages under "Fire Extinguishers."
