COLORADO LIFE TRAK

WHAT IS 'COLORADO LIFE TRAK'?

'Colorado Life Trak' is Broomfield Police Department's version of 'Project Lifesaver' which was established in April 1999, as an initiative of the 43rd Search and Rescue Company of the Chesapeake Sheriff's Office, in Chesapeake, Virginia.

This is a program designed to assist in finding individuals who wander away from home or become lost, because they suffer from autism, alzheimer's, dementia, or other memory loss related disorders. It is a proven lifesaving system that is reliable, responsive, practical and affordable.

The Police Department implemented 'Colorado Life Trak' in 2008 as part of our Senior Resource programs. An application process has been set up as a guideline for those in need of this service. A committee comprised of Broomfield Police Department, Emergency Management, Senior Services, and Health & Human Services, has been developed to assist our citizens with the application process.

WHO IS 'COLORADO LIFE TRAK' DESIGNED FOR?

The focus of the program is on those citizens of the City & County of Broomfield who suffer from Alzheimer's, Autism, Dementia, or other memory loss related disorders.

The Broomfield Police Department's initial implementation will be offered at no cost to Senior Citizen's residing in Broomfield, who meet guidelines and criteria outlined by the committee. Participants must:

- Be a resident of the City & County of Broomfield.
- Suffer from a memory loss disorder.
- Be at least 60 years of age.
- Be mobile, which includes those in need of assistance from a walker, cane, wheel chair, etc.



HOW DOES 'COLORADO LIFE TRAK' WORK?

As a part of the program a personalized state of the art radio transmitter designed to be worn as a bracelet, is issued to those citizens who are at risk of wandering away or becoming easily lost.

If a participant wanders away from home or becomes lost, a family member or caregiver would notify the

police department. A search and rescue team is activated and a mobile locator tracking system is used to locate the individual.

This radio transmitter bracelet allows search and rescue personnel to reduce

the amount of time to find your loved one; from days and hours, to minutes.



The Broomfield Police Department is currently accepting applications for participants in the program.

Applications that are received will be reviewed by the committee to determine if the criteria has been met. Applicants that meet the criteria will be placed on a list based on need and availability of units. Initially only 10 radio transmitter bracelets will be available to qualified participants on the list. If there are more than 10 approved participants, their name will be placed on a list and they will be notified when a device becomes available.
